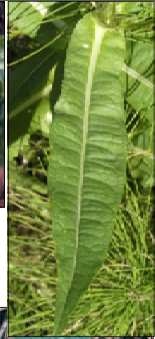


General: Biennial; up to 9' tall

Form first year: Basal rosette

Management Strategies

- Deep taproot: Remove all fragments
 - Primary spread: Seed
- Note: Taproot can be up to 2 1/2' long



Check with parks department or school district for proper disposal.

Flower: Tiny pink clusters, followed by prickly seedhead.



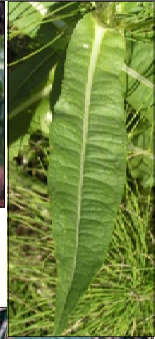
